

Chinese Running More Than 100 Grow Operations in Maine

Transnational Criminal Organizations (TCOs) run by Chinese citizens living in the United States have been running illegal marijuana growing operations at more than 100 properties in rural Maine, <u>according to</u> <u>an unclassified memo from the U.S.</u> <u>Department of Homeland Security (DHS)</u>.

Steve Robinson of the Maine Wire <u>reports</u> <u>that</u>, <u>upon investigation</u>, the properties in question all have similar qualities: they were purchased by Chinese men or women, have a strong marijuana odor, have trash from commercial growing products, have a large indoor area to grow, have blacked-out windows, have multiple security cameras, and have heat pumps that are constantly running.
