



Libertarian Javier Milei Wins Argentina's Presidential Election

Libertarian Party candidate Javier Milei won Argentina's runoff presidential election yesterday. Milei, a proponent of the Austrian School of economics, was an economist and writer before entering politics. Bloomberg results show that, with 99.28 percent of votes counted, Milei won with 55.69 percent, with Sergio Massa receiving 44.31 percent.

Argentinian voter Efrain Viveros, a 21-yearold student, celebrated the election results, telling Reuters, "We came to celebrate this historic triumph." He said Milei's win will change young Argentines' future for the better. "I'm honestly ecstatic. Milei represents change, for the better. With Massa we'd have had no future, our future has returned."
