

Netanyahu: Israel Listens to U.S. Input, but Will Make Final Decisions on Iran Strike

Following remarks earlier this month in which U.S. President Joe Biden <u>said he</u> <u>would not support</u> an Israeli strike on Iranian nuclear sites, <u>The Washington Post</u> <u>reported</u> that Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu informed Biden <u>during</u> <u>a conversation last week</u> that he is willing to consider only striking Iranian military targets. Netanyahu's office responded to <u>The</u> <u>Washington Post</u>, stating on X, "We listen to the opinions of the United States, but we will make our final decisions based on our national interests."
