



Supreme Court Allows Texas to Enforce Deportation Law

Earlier today the U.S. Supreme Court <u>voted</u> 6-3 to allow Texas to enforce Texas <u>Senate</u> Bill 4 and resume arresting and deporting migrants crossing the border illegally, as the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals continues litigation in <u>United States, Applicant v.</u> Texas, et al.

Texas Governor Greg Abbott believes the Supreme Court's decision is a positive development as the case returns to the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals, stating on X, "BREAKING: In a 6-3 decision SCOTUS allows Texas to begin enforcing SB4 that allows the arrest of illegal immigrants. We still have to have hearings in the 5th circuit federal court of appeals. But this is clearly a positive development."
