



Supreme Court Rejects J6 Public Office Ban Appeal

Couy Griffin, a former county commissioner in New Mexico's Otero County, had his appeal rejected by the U.S. Supreme Court earlier today. Griffin was disqualified from state and local office by a New Mexico district court due to a federal conviction where he served a 14-day prison sentence for entering a restricted area on January 6, 2021.

The Supreme Court stated in the <u>Trump v.</u>
<u>Anderson opinion</u> earlier this month, "This case raises the question whether the States, in addition to Congress, may also enforce Section 3. We conclude that States may disqualify persons holding or attempting to hold state office. But States have no power under the Constitution to enforce Section 3 with respect to federal offices, especially the Presidency."
