Government Mass Murder

As this magazine has had the unfortunate mission to document, human civilization has a disturbing tendency to engage in mass murder. An additional fact to be deplored is that this evil tendency is not a thing of the past. We need not turn to the pages of bloody history to find examples of mass-casualty events either worsened by government evil and incompetence or caused directly — and knowingly — by agents of authority. In fact, we've just witnessed one.

Specifically, we witnessed the terror and destruction of a forced public-health campaign — including the vax — that harmed lives rather than saved them. More than a year ago, I wrapped up writing the book <code>End Game</code>, which examined the Covid pandemic in historical and scientific context and concluded that a government-caused and -sponsored mass murder could not be ruled out. Though I hoped to be wrong, it seems the evidence is revealing the worst. As Veronika Kyrylenko reports in this issue, studies are showing that the vaccine has killed — and is killing — many people. While this might sound inflammatory, she cites studies demonstrating the facts that you won't see reported in the mainstream media.

That media, sadly, almost always covers up government-sponsored and -caused atrocities, rather than honestly reporting on them. The classic example of this is Stalin's mass starvation of Ukrainians in the Holodomor. From 1932 to 1933, the Soviets starved as many as 10 million people to death. The West had reporters on the scene, notably Walter Duranty of *The New York Times*. It was no secret to Duranty and others what was happening, but the *Times* and the Western press covered it up. Duranty won a Pulitzer for his perfidy.

This type of thing has happened whenever leftist, communist, and Deep State governments have engaged in atrocities. They can count on their press propagandists to cover for their crimes. In the 1980s, the brutal communist dictatorship in Ethiopia began a forced relocation program, disrupting the rural population during the growing and harvest season. Predictably, this led to a horrible famine and mass death and starvation. This received plenty of coverage in the West at the time, but it was largely described as an environmental disaster brought on by drought. The role of the regime in Addis Ababa was ignored.

Another present-day example is the war in Ukraine. Regardless of which side of the conflict you're on, the fact is that it shouldn't be happening at all. There is an obvious diplomatic solution for this — and it is the same one that existed prior to the onset of hostilities. That solution is to honor the original NATO and Western commitment not to expand the alliance to Russia's doorstep. This commitment, however, is not in line with Deep State and European Union goals. On October 2, a group of EU foreign ministers met in Kyiv, with Josep Borrell, the EU high representative for foreign affairs and security policy, calling Ukraine a "future member of the EU." Is the expansion of NATO and the European Union worth the lives of hundreds of thousands of Ukrainians and Russians and the risk of catastrophic escalation of tensions between Russia and the United States?

Whenever government gets involved, the situation, whatever it is, gets worse. This is why the American Founders sought to tie down the government with the chains of a Constitution that severely limited its power. Alas, those chains must be reattached and reinforced today, before the beastly dark-state regime breaks free. If that happens, we'll find ourselves — along with the rest of the world — whipped, broken, beaten, and strangled with chains forged by our adversaries when we weren't looking.
