Democratic Mayor **London Breed** believes that abolishing San Francisco's business taxes will reverse the steady loss of customary enterprises. For the first time, Florida Governor **Ron DeSantis** openly stated his opinion about the result of the 2020 presidential election. His statement during an August 8 interview conducted by NBC News amounts to a break in the Trump-DeSantis relationship at a time when Trump is heavily favored to win the 2024 GOP nomination.

Border Crossers Still Bringing Fentanyl Into U.S.

"I don't think the public is really aware of what a challenge this is. You have to assume that the border agents are not catching everything that's coming into our country. And the amount of fentanyl that's coming in keeps increasing."

An organic chemist and professor at the University of Oklahoma, **Donna Nelson** devotes much of her time to warning about fentanyl. To raise awareness about this problem, she organized a symposium on fentanyl during the American Chemical Society's annual meeting in San Francisco. She estimates that the amount of the drug seized at the border month after month "is enough to kill every person in our country."
