So I make the annual pilgrimage into the hunting woods each November, sometimes spending hours in the blistering cold just for an opportunity to fill my freezer with lean protein. While my son goes with me, he hasn't caught the hunting bug as severely as I have. Perhaps at some point he will, or he will find something else that will ignite a new tradition — a tradition of family and friends that will create lifelong bonds.
