"When your life hangs on the line, you don't want distractions that can cost Marines lives. I don't need a staff study. I've got Marines that came back to me as their commandant and said, 'we have concerns.' So if they have concerns, I do, too."

Two weeks before the vote that repealed the measure, Marine Commandant General **James Amos** told a Pentagon briefing of his concerns.

Explaining His Vote for the Recently Passed Tax Measure

"When the government takes less from you, it has not given you anything; it merely has harmed you less. Had this bill not passed, millions of Americans would have seen their paychecks shrink in January due to increased tax withholding. That is the plain and simple truth, and that is why I voted for the bill."
