"EPA's regulations are a backdoor attempt by unelected bureaucrats to implement the highly unpopular cap-and-trade legislation that was rejected last year."

Chairman of the House Energy and Commerce Committee, Congressman **Fred Upton** (R-Mich.) sponsored the blocking measure that passed with a voice vote. It now goes to the full House where it faces strong opposition.

College Entrants Found Sorely Deficient in Several Categories

"About three-quarters of the 17,500 freshmen at the [city's six] community colleges have needed remedial instruction in reading, writing or math, and nearly a quarter of the freshmen have required such instruction in all three subjects."

Citing data given to her by officials at the City University of New York, New York Times reporter **Lisa Foderaro** pointed to the \$33 million cost for these programs last year, all devoted to dealing with college entrants who already had earned a high-school diploma.
