Report Says Putin Likely Had a Role in Litvinenko's Death

"Taking full account of all the evidence and analysis available to me, I find that the FSB (Russia's Federal Security Service) operation to kill Mr. Litvinenko was probably approved by Mr. Patrushev and also by President Putin."

Retired judge Sir Robert Owen released copies of his 328-page report about the polonium-induced death of Russian defector Alexander Litvinenko in Britain nine years ago. The report pointed to Vladimir Putin and former FSB leader Nikolai Patrushev as likely perpetrators of the crime.

Military Action Against ISIL in Libya Being Considered
