"Last year the Taliban controlled 20 percent of Helmand Province. This year, they control 85 percent of the province."

Owner Announces End of Famous Circus

"It's a different model that we can't see how it works [for us] in today's world. This has been a very difficult decision for me and for the entire family."

His family bought the Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey Circus in 1967. But CEO Kenneth Feld pointed to declining ticket sales, mounting costs, changing public tastes, and battles with animal rights groups that prompted the Feld family's decision to terminate "The Greatest Show on Earth." Performances in May 2017 — in Providence, Rhode Island, and Nassau County, New York — will be the final shows for the 146-year-old company.

Outgoing Secretary of State Warns About Climate Change

"No nation will do well if it sits on the sidelines, choking on the fumes generated by obsolete technologies, and failing to share in the benefits of the clean-tech explosion."
