UN Day?

On October 23, 2017, the president of the United States, in recognition of "the more than seven decades of contributions the United Nations has made to peace and security among nations," proclaimed October 24, 2017, as "United Nations Day."

Here are some of the "contributions" that were made by the UN in December of 1961 in Katanga, a province of the former Belgian Congo, according to a book published in 1962 entitled *Forty-Six Angry Men: The 46 Civilian Doctors of Elisabethville Denounce U.N.O. Violations in Katanga*:

1) "Murder and assassination of unarmed civilians"; 2) "rape"; 3) "arbitrary arrests, with or without brutality"; 4) "unmotivated machine-gunning of civilian houses"; 5) "taking of hostages"; 6) "multiple thefts and looting"; 7) "bombing of the Prince Leopold Hospital in Elisabethville"; 8) "Murder, wounding, arrests of hospital orderlies of the Red Cross"; 9) "aerial destruction" by mortars of "houses, schools, social homes, churches"; and 10) "detention in concentration camps of 30,000 to 40,000 Balubas."

The president concluded his proclamation by urging everyone in the USA "to observe United Nations Day with appropriate ceremonies and activities." The only "appropriate" ceremonies and activities that come to mind involve a UN flag and a fireplace.
