Air Strikes Against Syria Deemed Acceptable by President

"The French, the United Kingdom, the United States, we worked together to maintain the prohibition on the use of chemical weapons. We did what we believe was right under international law, under our nation's laws."

Secretary of Defense James Mattis tried but failed to get President Trump to secure congressional approval for the mid-April air strikes against Syria. Once the action had been taken, he Mattis proclaimed that it was constitutionally acceptable.
