Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez' Gaffe Displayed in Lights

Paid for by Texas-based **Job Creators Network**, the message on a billboard in Times Square started with, "Thanks for nothing, AOC!" It was a response to the work of Representative Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez (D-N.Y.) persuading Amazon to scrap plans to create an eastern headquarters in New York City.
