Fla. Cops: Biden HHS Placed Minor Girl in Home of Illegal Alien, Who Raped Her Three Times

If the case of the [illegal alien suspected](#) in the Boulder, Colorado, terror attack isn't enough to show that the Biden administration's policies were dangerous, perhaps the illegal alien charged with repeatedly raping an "unaccompanied minor" the administration sent to live in the illegal alien's home might prove the point.

Cops in Palm Beach County Florida have arrested illegal Wilson Manfredo Lopez-Carillo. He is charged with thrice raping a 16-year-old girl.

The case highlights two problems with the Biden administration's policies: permitting unaccompanied minors to stay in the country if under 18, and shipping them to live with other, unvetted illegals.

The Rapes

Officially, the charges against Lopez-Carillo are "sexual battery," a euphemism for rape in Florida law. A police narrative posted by the Illegal Alien Crimes X feed shows that the girl's nightmare began when President Joe Biden's Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) sent her to live with Lopez-Carillo's family, which includes four kids.

The girl told cops she arrived in the United States in February 2023. During that month, more than 800 such kids encountered border agents, [data show](#). On May 13, the victim, now 18, told cops that 37-year-old Lopez-Carillo raped her three times. He was 36 at the time.

She "reported three instances of sexual battery by [redacted], all occurring in February 2024," the heavily redacted police narrative says:

[She] stated that [redacted] was not present during these incidents, as she would be out with her children selling tamales to support the family. She explained that [he] took advantage of [redacted's] absence to abuse her.



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NARRATIVE:

On May 13th, 2025, I was assigned this case for follow-up investigation. Eighteen-year-old [REDACTED] disclosed she was sexually battered by [REDACTED] thirty-seven-year-old, [REDACTED] on three separate occasions, in February of 2024. At the time of the incidents, the victim was sixteen years old, and the suspect was thirty-six. The reported incidents took place at [REDACTED] FL [REDACTED]

On this date, I made contact by telephone with [REDACTED] and her caretaker [REDACTED] to introduce myself and explain the investigative process. Both individuals agreed to cooperate with the case. [REDACTED] confirmed that she would provide a statement and press charges against [REDACTED]. It is important to note that [REDACTED] indicated she understands and speaks Spanish. As a result, a meeting was scheduled for the same day, May 14, 2023, at 2:00 p.m. I also contacted Palm Beach County Victim Services, and victim advocate Yuleidis Duque agreed to be present during the interview.

At the scheduled time, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] arrived at my office, located at 3228 Gun Club Rd, West Palm Beach, FL 33406. I conducted an individual interview with [REDACTED] with VA Yuleidis Duque present. The entire interview was recorded on my Body-Worn Camera (BWC) and later uploaded to evidence.com. Below is a brief synopsis of the statements made during the interview.

[REDACTED] stated she arrived in the United States on August 8th, 2023, as a minor (16 years old). She was placed by HHS to live with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] along with their four children and [REDACTED] at the aforementioned address.

Regarding this investigation, [REDACTED] reported three instances of sexual battery by [REDACTED] all occurring in February 2024. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] was not present during these incidents, as she would be out with her children selling tamales to support the family. She explained that [REDACTED] took advantage of [REDACTED] absence to abuse her. [REDACTED] reported that the incidents took place on Fridays.

The first incident occurred in the afternoon while [REDACTED] was in the kitchen. She reported that [REDACTED] approached her, grabbed her, and took her to his bedroom. He removed her pants and underwear and proceeded to sexually batter her. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] did not use any protection during the assault.

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That abuse began when Lopez-Carillo “grabbed her” in the kitchen “and took her to his bedroom,” the narrative alleges:

He removed her pants and underwear and proceeded to sexually batter her.

After he raped her a second time in his bedroom, she refused \$100 from him “to keep quiet.” A third rape “followed the same pattern,” the narrative alleges. She feared retaliation if she told cops, the narrative says.

The narrative also describes what happened when someone in the household — an adult woman apparently — noticed that Lopez-Carillo was way too friendly with the girl.



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NARRATIVE CONTINUATION

The second incident happened similarly, with [REDACTED] taking [REDACTED] to his bedroom and repeating the assault. [REDACTED] mentioned that [REDACTED] offered her \$100 to keep quiet, which she refused. Again, no protection was used.

The third incident followed the same pattern, with [REDACTED] assaulting [REDACTED] in his bedroom. [REDACTED] did not report these incidents to [REDACTED] or the police initially due to fear of retribution from [REDACTED], who had threatened her.

[REDACTED] reported that one day [REDACTED] eventually witnessed [REDACTED] hugging [REDACTED] inappropriately and confronted him. [REDACTED] denied any wrongdoing, claiming he was just getting water. Following this confrontation, [REDACTED] gave her three days to leave the house. [REDACTED] left after two days and sought refuge with [REDACTED] a friend from church, who agreed to take her in.

[REDACTED] contacted [REDACTED] to understand the situation, and [REDACTED] disclosed the sexual abuse. [REDACTED] confirmed that [REDACTED] had confessed to [REDACTED] about doing this to her. Since moving in with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] has felt safer and decided to now report the abuse to the police. She had no other information to provide.

Following this interview, I conducted an interview with [REDACTED]. This was also captured on my BWC (Body Worn Camera) and later uploaded into evidence.com. The following is only a brief synopsis of the statements made during this interview.

Regarding this investigation, [REDACTED] explained that he knew [REDACTED] from church and that she sought refuge at his home after being expelled from [REDACTED] house. He stated that [REDACTED] arrived at his home on a Friday in May of the previous year. [REDACTED] mentioned that [REDACTED] had expelled her without explanation, and [REDACTED] was afraid to disclose the reason.

[REDACTED] recounted that after [REDACTED] arrived, he contacted [REDACTED] to understand the situation. [REDACTED] revealed that [REDACTED] had sexually assaulted [REDACTED] which led to her expulsion. [REDACTED] expressed his shock and concern upon hearing this. He decided to allow [REDACTED] to stay in a room at his home to prevent her from being homeless.

[REDACTED] also mentioned that another girl, [REDACTED] who was [REDACTED] had also sought refuge at his home after [REDACTED] attempted to sexually assault her. [REDACTED] eventually left for Alabama to stay with other relatives after failing to find work locally.

[REDACTED] stated that he had been granted custody of [REDACTED] on April 23rd, 2025, after obtaining consent from her parents in Guatemala. He emphasized that [REDACTED] had been under his care and had been attending church regularly, which helped her recover from her traumatic experiences. [REDACTED] described [REDACTED] initial state when she arrived at his home as depressed and desperate. He noted that she had been drinking alcohol to cope with her trauma, but he set strict rules for her to follow, including attending church and avoiding alcohol. He observed significant improvements in her physical and emotional well-being over time. He had no other information to provide at this time.

After the interviews, [REDACTED] was asked if she would be willing to participate in a one-party consent call with [REDACTED]. The process and the importance of this call were explained to her, and she stated that she needed time to consider it.

On May 14, 2025, I contacted [REDACTED] by telephone, and she confirmed her willingness to proceed with the one-party consent call. A time was scheduled for 3:00 p.m. on the same day.

That woman "eventually witnessed [redacted] hugging [the girl] inappropriately and confronted him," the narrative alleges:

[He] denied any wrongdoing, claiming he was just getting water. Following this



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confrontation [redacted] gave [the girl] three days to leave the house. [She] left after two days and sought refuge with ... a friend from church, who agreed to take her in.

Thus ended the girl's nightmare. The same fate nearly befell another girl sent to live at the home, the narrative alleges.

Cops set up a phone call between the girl and Lopez-Carillo, who tried to blame her, the narrative alleges:

[She] confronted [him] about the past incidents. She repeatedly asked why he committed these acts, emphasizing that she was a minor at the time. [He] responded by attempting to justify his actions....

[She] continued to press [him], recounting specific instances where he forced her into the sexual acts, including removing her clothes and taking her to [his] bed. [He] did not deny these actions but instead tried to downplay their significance.... [He] attempted to shift the blame onto [her], mentioning that she had told him to "enjoy it." When confronted about the possibility of a pregnancy, due to unprotected sex, he mentioned giving [her] a pill. [She] firmly denied these claims, stating that she had suffered significantly because of his actions and that she had been forced out of [the] house as a result.

The pill, she said, was a Tylenol, the narrative says.



NARRATIVE CONTINUATION

At the scheduled time, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] arrived at my office, and the phone call was conducted in the Special Victims Unit interview room. Victim advocate Yuleidis Duque was present during the call. The following is a brief synopsis of the statements made during this call.

During the conversation, [REDACTED] confronted [REDACTED] about the past incidents. She repeatedly asked why he committed these acts, emphasizing that she was a minor at the time. [REDACTED] responded by attempting to justify his actions, stating that [REDACTED]. He acknowledged that [REDACTED]

Following the controlled call, I conducted a clarification interview with [REDACTED]. This was captured on my BWC (Body Worn Camera) and later uploaded into evidence.com. During this time, [REDACTED] advised me that she never consented to have a sexual intercourse with [REDACTED]. She stated she never told him to "enjoy it" and denied that she ever took any pill after the sexual abuse. She said that he only gave her a Tylenol for a headache. She reiterated that she was sexually battered by [REDACTED] and that he was lying.

On May 22nd, 2025 at approximately 4:13 p.m. Detective Carlos Rojas #36816 and I arrived at [REDACTED] in the [REDACTED] Beach, FL [REDACTED] in order to make contact with [REDACTED]. Upon arrival we met with [REDACTED] outside his residence and an interview took place. This was captured on my BWC. (This interview was conducted in Spanish as this is [REDACTED] primary language). The following is a brief summary of the statements made during that interview.

[REDACTED] was read his Constitutional Miranda Rights from a PBSO pre-printed card in Spanish. Post Miranda, [REDACTED] initially denied the allegations, and upon further questioning, he admitted [REDACTED]. He advised that [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] indicated [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] He said [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] He indicated [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] He admitted [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] He advised [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] reiterated that [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] He confirmed [REDACTED].

Based on the above investigation, probable cause exists to charge [REDACTED] with three counts of Sexual battery (victim 12-17 years of age, where [REDACTED] a person eighteen years of age or older, did commit sexual battery upon [REDACTED] a person 12 years of age or older but younger than 18 years of age, without [REDACTED] consent, by penetrating his penis inside her vagina and in the process thereof did not use physical force and violence likely to cause serious personal injury, contrary to Florida Statute 794.011(5)(a). (1 DEG FEL) (LEVEL 8)

The Charges

Cops arrested Lopez-Carillo on May 22 on three counts of sexual battery of a person 12 years old or older but younger than 18. Such a first-degree felony by an offender older than 18 [can end](#) in a 30-year prison sentence, a \$10,000 fine, and registering as a sex offender.

The court declared him an illegal alien on May 23.

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Unaccompanied Minor Victims of Biden

In its report on the case, The Daily Wire explained what led to the girl’s being placed in Lopez-Carillo’s home.

Biden’s policies of permitting minors who jumped the border to stay in the country “incentivized families to separate, paying human traffickers to take the children across the border alone,” the [website reported](#):

When the children arrived, they were astonishingly vulnerable to exploitation: they didn’t speak English, they were underage, they were in debt to cartels, and they were afraid to go to the police because they were illegal immigrants.

Worried about being accused of holding “kids in cages,” as far-left Democrats falsely said Trump did in a practice begun by the Obama administration, HHS simply sent the kids to live with unrelated, unvetted illegals such as Lopez-Carillo.

The [website continued](#):

As a result, contractors received billions of dollars to process the children, and HHS officials used makeshift vetting, such as having sponsors text a picture of a foreign passport to them.

But there was no way of knowing whether the sponsors were who they said they were, and no way to check foreign criminal records or the authenticity of documents with the governments of their home countries.

How many illegal-alien minors were repeatedly raped after the Biden administration sent them to live with illegal-alien sex fiends will likely never be known.



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
