



"Non-binary" Luggage Thief Brinton Arrested Again

The world's most incompetent luggage thief was bagged again this week.

This time, Sam Brinton — the "non-binary" chrome-domed sadist who briefly helped run the Biden administration's nuclear waste disposal bureau — is charged with swiping a suitcase at Ronald Reagan National Airport just outside Washington, D.C.

This time, the victim was the mostly unknown Tanzanian fashion designer Asyakhamsin. Brinton stole the bag in 2018 and appeared in her clothes publicly. But only now has the long arm of the law reached out. Police finally caught the light-fingered weirdo on Wednesday.

Cops in Montgomery County, Maryland, nabbed the clean-shaven kook at his home in Rockville, the *New York Post* reported.

The charges: Grand larceny for a theft that police found out about in February:

Arrest records show that Brinton — who is non-binary and uses they pronouns — was arrested on the 700 block of College Parkway as a fugitive from justice.

"They are being held at the Montgomery County Central Processing Unit on a no-bond status as they await an extradition hearing," an MCPD spokesperson explained. ...

The investigation is being spearheaded by the Metropolitan Washington Airports Authority Police....

The Tanzanian designer had shared images of the MIT grad wearing her stolen custom clothing in February.

"I saw the images. Those were my custom designs, which were lost in that bag in 2018," Khamsin told The Post, shortly after she tweeted images of Brinton in the brightly-colored frock.

She had shipped the clothing, which she had made by hand herself, to D.C. for a fashion show she was due to take part in.

"Recently I heard the news on @FoxNews about @sambrinton luggage issue surprisingly I found his

images wore my custom made outfits which was in the lost bag on 2018," she tweeted on February 20.

The Houston-based designer appeared on Tucker Carlson after she saw Brinton. Explaining that she traveled to Washington, D.C., to showcase her work, Asyakhamsin told Carlson that she reported the missing luggage at the airport, "but my bag was not found."

She spotted Brinton in her custom-made designs on Fox News in December. "Oh my God, I was shocked," she said. "For more than 40 years, I worked hard." Then she reported the theft to police in Houston.

"I was asking myself, 'How this person got my custom-made designs because it's one of a kind, and wear them without fear, and display in public. I don't accuse him as a thief," she continued, but questions must be answered. "What I need is justice now."

Of course, Brinton didn't return the luggage, she told Carlson.

Previous Thefts

Why the cops didn't arrest Brinton before this week we aren't given to know. After all, they weren't trying to crack the <u>Unabomber</u> case.

That aside, the latest arrest brings Brinton's rap sheet to at least three luggage capers.

Trouble began for the MIT grad — who could play <u>Dick Tracy's nemesis Cue Ball</u> if he didn't wear dresses, lipstick, and high heels — when surveillance cameras caught him with a pricey <u>Vera Bradley bag</u> that he swiped from the carousel from the airport in Minneapolis. That was in September.
