



Cuomo Ridicules Trump for Taking Hydroxychloroquine, but Took Quinine Himself to Fight Virus

<u>Chris "Fredo" Cuomo</u> had a pretty good time on Monday ridiculing President Trump for taking hydroxychloroquine, a malaria drug some doctors have <u>successfully prescribed</u> to help coronavirus patients.

Cuomo took great pains to show that Trump is ignoring science, and that the drug doesn't work on the Asiatic pathogen either as a cure or preventive.

<u>Cuomo said</u> Trump will win the public debate over the drug because he believes the drug will work and so "the science is irrelevant."

Using the drug, Cuomo opined, "speaks to optimism" and "speaks to strength."

Thus, "he wins this argument. Why? Because he believes. Because he's taking a chance. Because he's strong."

Then, in either the voice of a man who has <u>consumed way too much soy</u>, or perhaps Karen, the hectoring busybody of the <u>ubiquitous Internet meme</u> who always demands to speak with the manager, <u>Fredo mocked</u> the party of his strong, smart brother, Andrew, the governor of New York:

He's not the Party of No. He's not the Democrats — "No don't take the hydroxychloroquine, just in case. You stay home. You can't go out. You can't work. You can't eat. You can't live." That's where he's put the Democrats.

Mrs. Cuomo Begs to Differ

That isn't what his wife thought when she was giving him remedies from Linda Lancaster, an "energy medicine physician," as *The Daily Caller* reported.

At her *Purist* blog, <u>Christina Cuomo wrote</u> that "Chris's daily anti-virals from Dr. Lancaster" included this: "1 OKO-3x daily (stabilized oxygen, potentized quinine 3x homeopathic dilution prepared in Sac Lac base)."

A week later, TheDC noted, she explained what "potentized quinine" is:

Potentized quinine (OXO); it's derived from the nontoxic bark of Peruvian-grown quinine plants. It is a natural antibiotic (it's being used in India with very good results). This is not on the market here; Dr. Lancaster has made this in her lab for 40 years, and I took this for my Lyme. (The medicine Plaquinol, which many doctors are using for COVID-19 is similar to quinine, but it has negative side effects.)

Quinine, of course, is an anti-malarial drug kind of like <u>hydroxychloroquine</u>, brand name Plaquenil. Indeed, as <u>TheDC</u> observed, the latter is a synthetic derivative of the naturally-occurring substance that Christina Cuomo gave her husband.

The newsman's better half also suggested that virus patients might consult a "Chinese herbalist or naturopath," which raises the question of whether the skeptical anchorman believes the science he claims that Trump has dismissed.

Cuomo's prescribing "doctor," his wife informed readers, is "an energy medicine and homeopathic physician" who practices "light harmonics," a "healing system based on the philosophies of yoga, ayurveda, anthroposophy, TCM, naturopathy and homeopathy."

Avurveda is Indian pseudoscience, while anthroposophy is German mysticism.

Radionics, <u>another of Lancaster's methods</u>, uses <u>electromagnetic radiation</u> to heal illness. <u>She also trained in</u> medical <u>radiesthesia</u>, another pseudoscientific practice that involves using the hands or dowsing rods to detect corporeal radiation.

A look at Lancaster's website suggests that she has healing powers far beyond those of more pedestrian physicians who graduated from medical school — such as Dr. Anthony Fauci, who <u>has appeared</u> on Cuomo's program and <u>called him every day</u> while he was sick.

Cuomo's viewers might like to hear Cuomo explain the science behind his decision to take quinine.

Clash With Cyclist

The <u>unusual diet and treatment regimen</u> Cuomo endured might be one reason he flew into a rage when a cyclist confronted him on Easter Sunday about breaking guarantine.

Identified as David, the cyclist was riding by Cuomo's ritzy property when he spotted the familiar face.

"Is that Chris Cuomo?" the <u>curious cyclist said he asked</u> the hot-headed anchor's wife. "Isn't he supposed to be quarantined?"

That's when Cuomo exploded <u>like Tony Soprano</u> after a bad day at the <u>Bing</u>.

"Who the hell are you?!" Cuomo asked the shocked "fat-tire biker," as Cuomo described him. "I can do what I want!"

Then, David said, Don Cuomo warned of what was to come:
