



UN "Double Standards" at Anti-Trump Protest Slammed by CFACT's Craig Rucker

KATOWICE, Poland — In this interview with The New American magazine from the United Nations COP24 climate-change summit, Committee for a Constructive Tomorrow (CFACT) Executive Director Craig Rucker slammed the UN for its double standards in the handling of protests and activism.
