

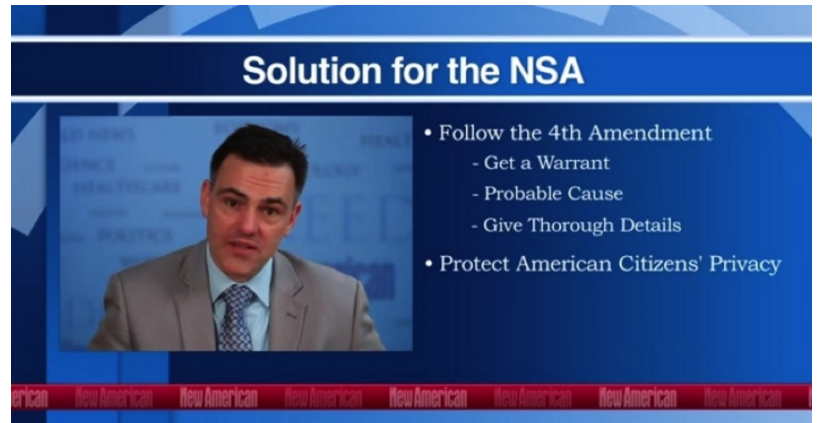

Tom Eddlem on the NSA (Video)

Tom Eddlem, writer for *The New American* magazine, explains the constitutional problems with the NSA collecting metadata from e-mails and cellphones. There is also evidence, Eddlem noted, that the NSA may actually be recording content of e-mails and phone calls.
