



Epic Failure: "Hardball's" Chris Matthews Flops on "Jeopardy!"

Television savant <u>Chris Matthews</u>, who ridiculed <u>Sarah Palin</u>, the failed GOP vice presidential candidate, as severely lacking in brain power, may now be regretting those words.

With the category "Law and Order," the answer was, "A U.S.D.C is one of these, charged with the jurisdiction of a specific region."

Matthews responded, "What is a U.S. attorney?"

And this guy has the nerve to ridicule anyone. Where do you find "attorney" in the acronym "U.S.D.C.?"

Obviously, the correct response was district court.

But Matthews' blundering didn't stop there, <u>Sheppard observed</u>. As time went on, the audience got the following from the man <u>who thinks</u> Rick Perry is "Bull Connor with a smile," <u>but told</u> a black pastor he needed to "evolve" because he opposes <u>President Obama's declaration</u> that Adam and Steve can marry:

"In 1986, the Supreme Court ruled that the 'hostile environment' type of this can be sex discrimination."

Matthews responded, "What is a hostile workplace?" This brainiac thinks the same word can be in both the answer AND the question.

Attacking Gov. Palin

Matthews' cerebral power having been established, it's worth reprising what he said about Sarah Palin's sagacity. Sheppard provided the requisite quotes.

On Oct. 2, 2008. Matthews unbosomed this assessment of the former Alaska Governor's intelligence:

Is this [vice presidential debate] about her brain power?... Senator, do you think Sarah Palin is qualified to be President of the United States? ... If she were on *Jeopardy!* right now and the topic was national government, American government generally defined, would she look like an imbecile, or would she look okay? Does she know anything?

And he ridiculed her brains again on Jan. 19, 2011:

I'd like to see her on just a couple of episodes of *Celebrity Jeopardy!* or *It's Academic* Mac McGarry to just see if she knows anything.

That's what many Americans were thinking about Matthews.
