



"Funding Father of the Right" Backs Hillary for President

"[That] meeting and her remarks during it changed my mind about her," Scaife admitted in a laudatory editorial entitled "Hillary, Reassessed."

Just before Pennsylvania's presidential primaries, Scaife's newspaper, the *Pittsburgh Tribune-Review*, published a glowing endorsement of Hillary Clinton. Only thus can be explained the transformation of the man the *Washington Post* once styled the "Funding Father of the Right" into a Hillary Clinton supporter.
