“Coups” Against Trump Failed, But Danger Remains: Roger Stone

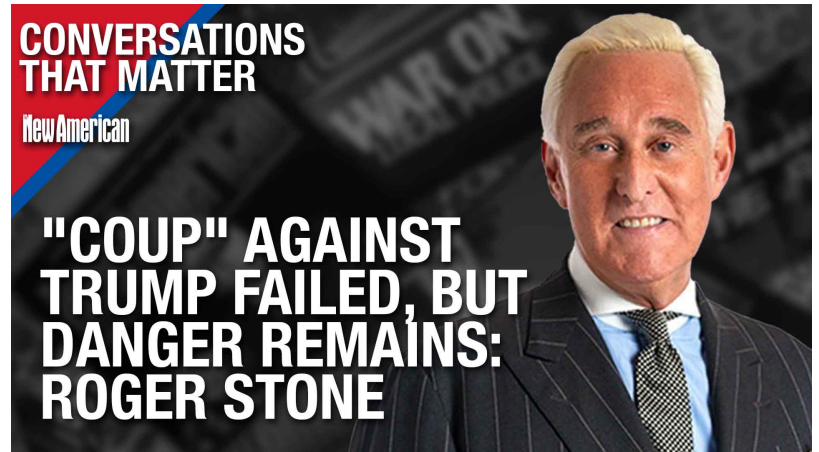
Based on his insights into American politics and especially the assassination of John F. Kennedy and the attempted murder of Ronald Reagan, legendary political operative Roger Stone knew less than one year into Trump’s presidency that he would be targeted, too.

In this explosive interview with The New American magazine Senior Editor Alex Newman for Conversations That Matter, Stone revisits those predictions he made in a late 2017 interview with Newman and goes deeper.
