Dinesh D'Souza: Archaeology Proves the Bible's Validity—With No Contradictions!

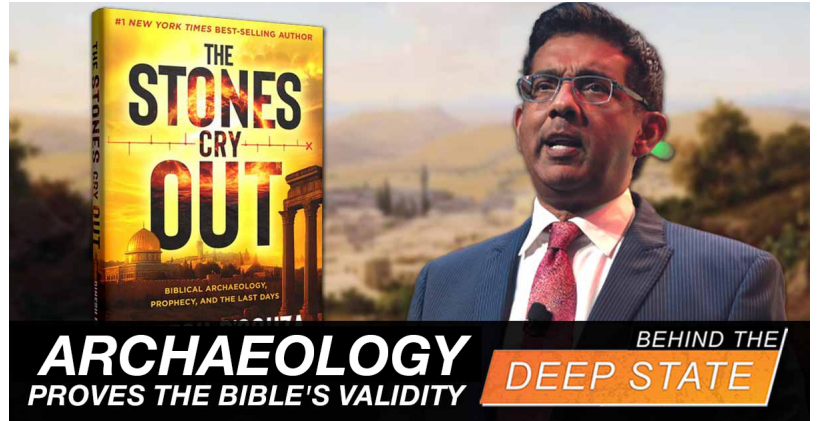
