



Dr. Pierre Kory: Addressing Epidemic of Post-vaccine Syndrome and Long Covid

The Covid-19 emergency is officially over, but the United States is facing the covert epidemic of long Covid as well as post-vaccine syndrome, which affected approximately eight percent of vaccine recipients.
