Foundations ‘Bribing’ Police Departments to Release Criminals

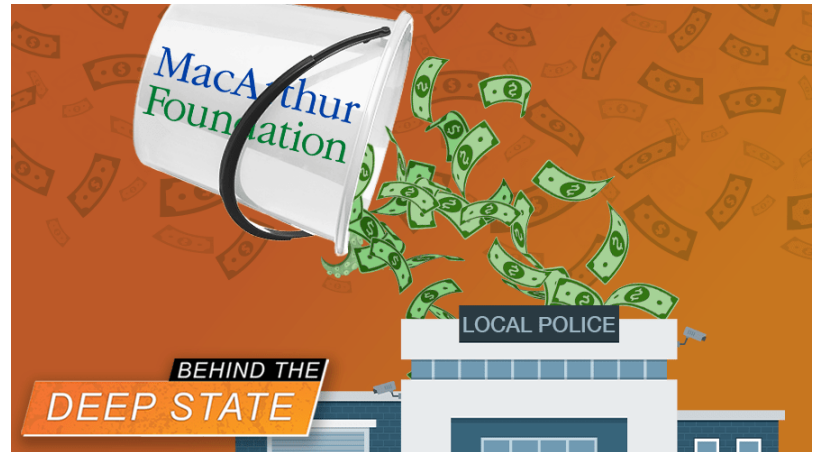
