Nullification is "the reserved power to nullify (or invalidate) any unconstitutional action... not only by refusing to implement it, but also by declaring it null, void, and of no force within a jurisdiction." This explanation provided by The John Birch Society describes one of the most fundamental principles upon which the United States of America were established. It expresses the truth that the federal government is subservient to the states.
