



Man Claims He Spotted Infamous Gangster Whitey Bulger, Who Allegedly Died in 2018

Nick Fiorillo, the founder of GotSpaceDataPartners.com, claims that he spotted Whitey Bulger, an infamous gangster who was allegedly murdered in 2018, and reported it to the FBI who begged him not to go public.
