SHARM EL-SHEIKH, EGYPT — The International Court of Justice must rule on the issue of "climate change" to guide national authorities in the global battle against human emissions of carbon dioxide, "youth" climate-justice activist Mert Taner Kumru told The New American magazine's Alex Newman at the United Nations COP27 climate summit.
