



Muslims Attack EDL Bus In London, EDL Members Arrested

The "Asians" <u>launched rocks and bottles</u> at the bus, which broke down in the dangerous place, and then attacked a white woman who exited the bus. <u>Police arrested</u> the victims of the attack and not the attackers.

The sudden upsurge of hornet-like violence is yet another sign the EDL is hitting a nerve. It is protesting the Islamization of England, and the "Asians" don't like it.

During the past three years, Muslims <u>have</u> repeatedly called for Sharia law in England, and one radical suggested that Muslims should kill the royals at the recent nuptials of Prince William and Kate Middleton.



Returning From a Rally

The brazen attack was unprovoked and obviously a sign of growing Muslim muscle in England.

The bus broke down in <u>Tower Hamlets</u>, a Muslim-controlled territory where homosexuals are afraid to walk the streets, a Christian teacher <u>was attacked</u> and beaten to within an inch of his life, and Muslims try to enforce Sharia law.

"The yellow, red and black bus, carrying around 44 EDL members, was showered with stones as angry teenagers threw traffic cones and bricks, shattering the windows of the bus, the <u>Daily Mail reported</u>.

A <u>video on YouTube shows</u> the coach, in Mile End Road, being surrounded with protesters, who scream at the members and throw things at them....

When the double-decker bus began to try and leave the area, youths tried to block its path by sitting in the road, but fled when police charged at them.

Asians Attack

According to the BBC, the coach stopped once, whereupon some the 44 EDL passengers disembarked. They grappled with the "Asians."

When the bus was leaving, it broke down, which is when the angry swarm of 100 "Asians" attacked with bottles, bricks, and traffic cones. The video shows "Asians" tossing cones through the broken window of the bus. Although Muslims attacked the bus, police arrested the 44 members of the EDL on the bus.

<u>Said a spokesman</u> for the Metropolitan Police, "All those on the coach were arrested for public order offences and an investigation is ongoing to identify others outside the bus who participated in the disorder."

After the "Asians" were finished tossing cones into the window of the bus, <u>video shows</u>, they beat up a girl who was lying on the ground.





Tower Hamlets

Muslims now control the Tower Hamlets neighborhood where the anti-EDL attack took place, and they are lashing out at anyone perceived to not adhere to Islamic law. One of the more notorious crimes involved four Muslims, who <u>turned out to be</u> terror suspects, <u>who beat</u> a teacher to a pulp because he taught a religion class in the Muslim neighborhood and exposed students to faiths other than Islam.

The four thugs, whom British intelligence <u>was investigating</u>, planned the attack for some time. A listening device in their car recorded one of the men thusly: "This is the dog we want to hit, to strike, to kill."

Their attack was the third of three attempts to kill the teacher, the first two having failed.

Teachers in the neighborhood have reported that Muslims are trying to enforce Islamic dictates, and violence against teachers in the neighborhood is escalating, the <u>Daily Telegraph</u> reported.

The number of assaults on teachers in Tower Hamlets resulting in exclusions has more than doubled from 190 in 2007/8 to 383 in 2008/9, the latest available year, though not all are necessarily race-related.

Imposing the dictates of Sharia appears to be the goal. Another pack of Muslims <u>beat up</u> a coreligionist because he refused to observe the ban on smoking during the Muslim holy days of Ramadan.

Such is the Islamic supremacy in the neighborhood that an anti-Catholic homosexual <u>has charged</u> that police are covering up crimes for fear of being accused of racism.

<u>Stickers bearing</u> the words "gay-free zone" can be seen in the neighborhood, and Muslims have disrupted public meetings with imitations of animal noises and shouts of "poofter" at homosexual officials.

Marching for Sharia

Muslims in Britain are frequently in the streets <u>calling for</u> the imposition of Sharia, or Islamic law.

Muslims protestors have <u>shut down</u> entire streets in England, <u>marching with signs</u> that call for the world-wide imposition of Sharia. Signs have said, "Islam the solution for mankind" and "democracy will bring oppression," along with the more ominous warning that "Sharia will dominate the world."

Such is the Islamic power in England that authorities do nothing about overt threats of violence. In April, radical imam <u>Anjem Choudary warned Muslims</u> to stay away from the nuptials of Prince William: "All Muslims should stay away from the public gatherings like the royal wedding and the Olympics because there is a very high likelihood of an attack."

Choudary also said such an attack would be applauded.

If my brothers decide to use the opportunity when the world is looking at the Royal Family to pass a message so that we can avoid more deaths of innocent men, women and children in Afghanistan, that should be applauded.

EDL Under Attack

The <u>British government banned</u> the EDL from protesting for 30 days, but the group, which is <u>trying to stop</u> the Islamization of the sceptr'd isle, marched anyway in what it called a "static protest."

EDL's leader Tommy Robinson <u>was arrested</u> during the EDL's illegal protest that took place before the "Asian" swarm attacked the EDL buses. He is <u>on a hunger strike</u> and has declared himself a political







prisoner.

Robinson vows to continue protesting the growing threat of Islam no matter what the law says.
